PJP II Commemorates Canonizations

The Pope John Paul II Regional Catholic Elementary School community celebrated a special mass at St. Peter Church in West Brandywine to honor the recent canonizations of Pope John XXIII and Pope John Paul II, the school's patron saint. Rev. Michael J. Fitzpatrick served as primary celebrant assisted by concelebrants: Rev. Thomas J. Brennan, Rev. Francis J. Mulranen and Rev. John V. Oulds. Thirty three students took part in the music ministry for the mass which was led by Music teacher Patricia Lutz.

At the close of mass, the Pre K and Kindergarten students processed into the Church followed by the President and Vice President of Student Council who enthroned the picture of St. John Paul II to mark this historic event. As the enthroning took place, the student body sang the school hymn "Crossing the Threshold of Hope" written by, retired music teacher, Pat Lamb. The refrain "*John Paul II, we love you*" was repeated throughout the song.

Finishing the Dream Campaign Begins

Steady enrollment growth has presented the school with an exciting opportunity to welcome new families desiring a Catholic education. The school was recently granted approval to launch a marketing campaign to finish the top floor (2nd floor) of the school. The school's advisory council has been assisting Sr. Anne with the project which is anticipated to be finished by the opening of the 2015-16 school year.

When completed, the top floor will contain six classrooms for the seventh and eighth grade students in addition to an art/music room available to the entire student body. The top floor classrooms will be outfitted with lockers instead of cubbies to give the feel of a "junior high." This project will also open up opportunities on the ground and second floor including: expansion of the Pre-K program, a resource room to aid children with learning differences, the re-establishment of the world language room and an art/science room equipped for the younger children.

The campaign goal has been set at \$1.0 million. All fundraisers including the new "*Finishing the Dream*" Raffle (further details below) will be earmarked for the top floor project. Annual Auction & Restaurant Fair

Pope John Paul II Regional Catholic Elementary School is pleased to announce the 16th Annual Silent Auction and Restaurant Fair, "*Raising the Roof, Finishing the Dream*", to be held on Saturday, November 8th, 2014 at 6 pm. The excitement and energy associated with Pope John Paul II will once again be demonstrated at a Western Hoedown- themed Silent Auction and Restaurant Fair. The event consists of raffles, hundreds of silent auction items, wine pull, live auction and food and beverage offerings from local restaurants. Proceeds from the Silent Auction will go directly to the completion of the school's second floor. In addition to being one of the school's largest and most important fundraising opportunities, the Silent Auction is the school's largest volunteer effort and biggest social occasion of the year. Parental and community support of the event is critical to its success. Tickets are \$20 per person/\$25 at the door and will go on sale this September.

During this year's Silent Auction and Restaurant Fair, over \$25,000 in cash and tuition credit prizes (17 prizes in all) will be paid out to winners of the "*Finishing the Dream*" raffle drawing. Tickets are \$100 each and only 1000 tickets will be sold making the odds of winning very high. The raffle is open to anyone over the age of 18 years.
